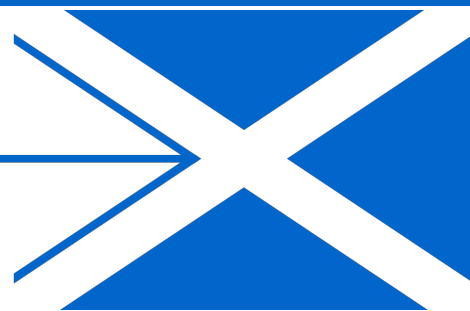

This talk describes research carried out for Collins COBUILD *English Usage* to establish how sociocultural changes have affected language use, both lexically and grammatically. We will examine how communication via social media increasingly blurs the lines between language varieties and register, and look at the ways in which changing attitudes towards certain social groups have affected language use.
